CH SUFFIX AVAILABLE FOR THE HACKNEY

The American Hackney Horse Society and Foundation have worked together to create a new program which will provide a CH (champion) suffix for Hackneys with champion show records. Applications for the program will be placed on the website and can be downloaded by any member interested in applying for the suffix designation for any Hackneys which qualifies.

MEMBERSHIP DUES INCREASE FOR 2008

American Hackney Horse Society membership dues will increase for 2008. Membership dues received in the American Hackney Horse Society office prior to December 1, 2007 will be accepted at the old rates. Payments received December 1, 2007 and after will be at the new rates:

Life \$1000.00 - Individual \$50.00 - Family \$75.00
 Junior \$25.00 - Associate \$ 150.00

AHHS 12th Annual Limited Breeder's Weanling Stake

2008 Auction - 2009 Weanling Competition - 2012 3-Year-Old Competition

In the eleven years the AHHS Limited Breeder's Stakes Program has been in existence over \$285,000.00 in prize money has been awarded. The 12th Annual 2009 Limited Breeders' Weanling Stakes will be held in Indianapolis, Indiana, during the All American Classic Horse Show, and will pay back to 10 places. The donor of the stallion services that sell will be able to nominate a mare of their own at no charge. Anyone who donates a stallion service, which sells, has the right to designate a mare of his/her own; therefore, two offspring of each stallion may be eligible for the 2009 weanling competition and if the sustaining payments are made, eligible to show as a 3-Year-Old in 2012.

Donors will not be required to buy back services which do not sell. If the service does not sell, the donor may purchase the service at 50% of the advertised stud fee. Purchasers of the services are eligible to show one weanling in 2009.

All owners, co-owners, and handlers of eligible weanlings must be current members of the American Hackney Horse Society as well as the judges for the class. Membership dues must be current by September 1 of the year of showing in order to show or judge.

Prize Money: 75% of the 2008 Stallion Service Auction proceeds will be paid out in the weanling classes. The remaining 25% will be held in a savings account to supplement the 2012 3-Year-Old classes. Prize money will be paid to ten places with 1st place paying 35%, 2nd place paying 20%, 3rd place paying 15%, 4th place paying 10%, 5th place paying 7%, 6th place paying 5%, 7th place paying 4%, 8th place paying 4%, 9th and 10th place each receiving \$250.00. In the event the classes do not fill the following payout percentages will apply. All prize money will be distributed.

1. .. 100%
2. .. 60% 40%
3. .. 50% 30% 20%
4. .. 45% 25% 20% 10%
5. .. 40% 25% 20% 10% 5.0%
6. .. 40% 25% 20% 10% 2.5% 2.5%
- 7+ .. 40% 25% 15% 10% 5% 2.5% .. 2.5%

Anyone who donates a stallion service, purchases a stallion service, or designates a mare, will be eligible to cast one ballot to nominate three people as prospective judges for the Class. From the list of nominated judges, the two people receiving the highest number of votes, will be asked to form the judging panel for the Class. The third judge will automatically be the All American Horse Show judge. Judges will not be allowed to judge two (2) consecutive shows, and are not allowed to show in any class at the All American Horse Classic.

Stallion Service Auction:

The stallion services donated are auctioned individually. The bidding will start at one-half (minimum fee \$500.00) the current stallion service fee, and the minimum bid accepted will be one-half the advertised stud fee. Bids will be accepted in person, through an agent, via cell phone, via the AHHS website, or sealed bids should be mailed to the AHHS office and postmarked on or before Friday, December 31, 2007, to be accepted. Each sealed bid will be opened at the time the service sells. A check must accompany the sealed bid and will be returned if the bid is not the successful purchaser. All stallion service fees must be paid at the auction. **If a stallion service fails to sell, the donor of the stallion service may purchase the service at 50% of the advertised stud fee, within 30 business days of written notification. The purchaser and the donor of the service are both eligible to show one weanling in 2009; therefore, two weanlings may be eligible for each stallion service sold.** The donor may locate a stallion service buyer up until written notification expires.

Funding For 3-Year-Old Class:

25% of the total stallion service auction will go toward the 3-Year-Old Performance class. One additional FEATURED stallion service will be auctioned with the total proceeds being added to the 25%. The sustained eligibility payments will be added to the above to fund the class.

* The stallion owner will designate, at the time he/she signs the contract, which division the foal of that stallion will show in -horse or pony.

Neither the AHHS nor its Board of Directors will intervene between the purchaser of the stallion service and the stallion owner. All contracts, arrangements and negotiations that arise in the service of any designated mare for the Limited Breeders' Stake will be strictly between the mare owner and the stallion owner. Some stallion owners may offer transported semen.

* In case of the untimely death of a stallion before the mare is bred, or, if the stallion becomes infertile a refund for the purchased service will be paid to the purchaser once a certificate verified by a licensed veterinarian is received in the AHHS office.

Prize Money:

1. The American Hackney Horse Society, Inc. will retain 10% of the auction proceeds. Accumulated interest from the date of the auction until distribution, will become a portion of the purse.

Designating the Mare:

1. To be eligible for the competition, a copy of the registration certificate for the designated mare, bred by the purchased stallion service, must be received by the AHHS before December 31 of the year of breeding.

2. The right to designate the mare's foal cannot be postponed to the following year.

Requirements for Weanling Eligibility:

1. The owner, co-owners, and showman/woman, of the weanling showing in the Limited Breeders' Stake must be a current AHHS member.

2. Stallion, mare, and foal must be parentage verified at the expense of the owner. **DNA test kit requests must be on file in the AHHS office by August 31** of the year showing.

3. All weanlings showing in the Limited Breeders' Weanling Stake may be subject to parent verification by DNA by the AHHS following the competition. All weanlings may be drug tested. Use of laxis will be permitted.

Rules for Showing Weanlings:

1. The weanling will enter at a trot and proceed to the judges for line-up.

2. The weanling will be asked to work both directions on the rail and then will be dismissed to the other side of the ring to await further instructions.

AHHS 12th Annual Limited Breeder's Weanling Stake (continued)

3. A workout will take place.

* The AHHS reserves the right to make decisions and changes regarding this program.

Requirements for 3-Year-Old Performance Class:

1. Any foal which was eligible for the weanling stakes competition in 2009 will also be eligible for the 3-year-old competition in 2012 provided all sustaining payments are paid on time.

2. The weanling is not required to show as a weanling to be kept eligible for the 3-year-old class.

3. All sustaining payments will be due February 15. The yearling payment is \$100.00, the 2-year-old payment is \$75.00, and the 3-year-old payment is \$50.00.

Rules for Showing in the 3-Year-Old Performance Class:

1. 3-Year-Olds will be shown in harness, to a 2-wheeled roadster type vehicle, with a snaffle bit and side check or an over check.

2. 3-Year-Olds will enter the ring counter clock wise and show at a park trot and extended trot. Hackneys will reverse and show at the same two gaits.

3. All 3-Year-Olds must have DNA parentage verification and registration on file in the AHHS office by August 1st of the year of showing.

4. All 3-Year-Olds may be drug tested and mouthed for age verification.

II. Approval of Meeting Minutes:

1. Saturday, February 24, 2007 Board of Directors meeting. Motion to approve Board minutes – Matt Schuckert Sandra Surber 2nd Motion Carries

Recording Secretary's Responsibilities:

C. Secretary (Recording):

1. Essential Functions: Operations Manual See By-Laws, Article VI - Officers, Section 4. Secretary...

By-Laws Section 4. Secretary.

The Secretary shall keep the minutes of the proceedings of the Members and of the Board of Directors in one or more books provided for that purpose and shall sign such minutes. The Secretary shall perform such other duties as from time to time may be assigned by the President or the Board of Directors.

2. Major Duties And Responsibilities:

Operations Manual Record and type the meeting minutes for the Board of Directors meetings, in election of officers meeting, the general membership meetings, and Regional Association meeting. First email the minutes to the President and the Executive Secretary to proofread. Make corrections and then email the meeting minutes along with a cover letter asking each Board member to read and approve or mark corrections on the minutes and return the cover letter to the AHHS office. The cover letter should also include an RSVP section and date of the next Board meeting along with the DEADLINE for committee reports to be received in the AHHS office to be included in the upcoming meeting package.

III. Executive Committee: Judith Lowry, Chair, reporting.

1. Charles Fitzpatrick sent the board a letter stating he was ill on February 24 and therefore unable to attend the board meeting. This was the first missed meeting and no action is required.

2. USEF Federation Representatives: As a recognized Affiliate the AHHS is a recognized resource for information on competitions of interest which might benefit from a Federation Representative visit. (see attached letter)

IV. President's Report: Judith Lowry, President, reporting.

IT Technology Summit: Our Executive Secretary, with my approval, attended an IT meeting in Lexington Kentucky. The meeting included all USEF affiliates organizations and was geared toward standardizing shared data.

Fund-raising: In April, Rudy Lewis presented me with the prototypes of a Hackney Championship Ring (1 ladies' and 1 man's ring. His thought was that they might be presented to the winner of the 3 Saturday night World Champion ponies at Louisville. The option would be open for the breeder, trainer and/or owner of the winning pony to purchase additional rings to commemorate the occasion. This would allow us the opportunity to generate income from the project. I took the liberty of paying for an appraisal of the rings personally. The rings are here for you to examine today. All information regarding the rings will be found in your meeting packet and will be discussed during the fund-raising committees report.

Trophies: On June 23, 2007 our trophies for the Futurities, etc. arrived with the wrong inscription. Dr. Crosby as Trophy Committee chair was contacted immediately and as of this writing, June 25, is still trying to determine where the problem occurred. The engraving is unacceptable and cannot be presented as is.

Stud Book: Work is still in progress. Darrel will have a complete report

USEF Hackney Committee Meeting: Held July 10, 2007, in Lexington Report from Judy.

AHHSF Building Project: At this time, Carl Nichols has advised me that the management of the Kentucky Horse Park has said the AHHSF will not be able to build in the Horse Park. He may have an update for us at the meeting. Carl Nichols spoke and advised the Board that he is actively looking for a suitable site for the building outside the Horse Park that would suit our needs as well as attract potential tenants. He will keep us updated as to his progress.

V. Executive Secretary's Report:

Frances Bjalobok reported.

Horse Show Secretaries: With the passing of the new rule that owners and trainers must be AHHS members to compete at USEF horse shows we are now faced with the problem of providing shows with a current list of members. Here are some options:

Quick Fix: On the Hackney website home page click "Documents And Forms" then under "Competition Managers" add a PDF with a single line membership listing. Show management will have to scroll through the list to find a name and they will not be happy about this because it takes to long. This is the quick fix and it might be a good idea to do this before your meeting.

Plan B: USEF and USDF have shared information files that horse show management or mostly horse owners can use to prove current membership and point toward year-end awards. If you go to www.everification.org and use the horses' name ROCHER and the person's name Charles Adam you will be able to walk through the site and at the end print the verification show management needs to remit with your entries.

If the Hackney Society would like to become a part of the data base we can but it will require time, effort and a commitment by the Society.

Plan C: The Hackney Society will be looking at a presentation by Mark Haupt for his online software before the July 14 board meeting. The website is www.horsecstudbook.com or using this page link <http://www.horsecstudbook.com/pages/Persons.aspx> you can go straight to the members record area. The cost for this program is \$20.00 per member per year and to date the American Show Pony Registry, American Shetland Pony Club

are using this package.

Plan D: In about two years the Arabian Horse Association's plans to write software modules that other breeds can purchase to go online and they may offer a service to host and store the sites. This seems like a long way out but the Hackney Society has to come up with away to pay for this and two years might be closer than we think.

Plan E: During the last week of June a copy of a registry file was emailed to the American Quarter Horse Association (AQHA). They were going to look at the file for us to determine if any of the AQHA software might work for the AHHS to go online with the registry and membership. To date I have not heard back from him.

David Estis has advised that he will take care of contacting Ginny Grulkey and setting up a system with her of getting the information online for the show secretaries to be able to verify the current membership list.

Sandra Surber and her Associate Membership Committee will draft a letter and come up with guidelines and cost for publications seeking statistics etc that require in-house research.

Kentucky Breeders' Development Fund: For 2005-2006 the fund awarded the American Hackney \$13,500.00, which was split equally between the ponies and the horses. For a list of winners and payouts please refer to the summer newsletters.

Membership: As of June 25, 2007 the Society records 1,038 members in good standing with 1,173 voting members. This includes 628 Individual, 210 Family, 75 Youth, and 125 Life members. At this time in 2006 the Society recorded 861 members in good standing with 950 voting members. The overall increase is 410 more members and 223 more voting members. In part the increase may be attributed to the registry rules changes requiring membership and the passing of the USEF rule that owners and trainers must be members to show.

Newsletter: Seven-hundred and sixty-three spring newsletter were mailed the week of April 30 to all members in good standing at a gross cost of \$1,451.43 (printing \$909.48, postage \$541.95). Less advertising revenue of \$222.50 thus a net cost was \$1,228.93 or \$1.61

per newsletter.

Parent Verification Costs: The University of California at Davis has a feature on their website which allows clients to produce their own DNA test kits. In April the AHHS office started using this feature and by producing and mailing the kits from the Hackney office we should reduce our DNA processing expenses by approximately \$2,600.00 per year.

Postal Equipment: In an effort to reduce overall postage expenses we will no longer lease a postal scale and meter. The office plans to purchase a new scale (\$200.00) and use stamps. In 2006 the Society paid \$1,163.14 to lease the equipment.

Promotions/Society: The 2nd Annual Media Day hosted by the Kentucky Horse Park and the National Horse will be on September 13, 2007. This event is open to all media and will include the Hackney Horse and pony in the breed demonstration. The purpose of Media Day is for the National Horse Center (that's us) to be a part of the FEI World Games 2010 Media Summit. The Summit will be held at the Kentucky Horse Park and we will have four events prior to the Games to polish up our presentation. The breed demonstrations can be filmed and aired in down/as fillers during the games.

Stud Book: Starting in February the stallion, mare, and gelding indexes by year have been shipped to Jay Kennedy for proofreading. On June 15 the final indexes for 2006 were delivered to Jay. I have been updating the board lists, award winners, transfers, name changes etc. to include 2005 and 2006. To date we have 635 pages.

USEF Information Technology Summit: The Summit was very informational and included equine breed representatives from across the United States. Each organization briefly described their existing IT capabilities and future plans. Operating budgets ranged from \$1 million to zero funds and in-kind donations. It was decided that the best way we can start working together to enhance the sport technology was to create a standard for the different affiliates to share information. To achieve this goal a subcommittee was

formed to create an XML schema and an area was established on USEF's website to share information
www.usef.org/dnn/eti

VI. Financial and Treasurer's Report: Lambert Jr. Schut, Chair, reporting. The 2006 990 tax form was filed in May as required with the federal government and a copy filed with the State of Kentucky. For the fund balances and the six month report see the attached sheets. I still feel we should adopt a refund policy, the present system is costing the Society time and money. Maybe an administration fee could be charged.

Motion: The AHHS adopt a policy of charging a \$5.00 fee to process a refund. If the refund due is over \$5.00 the check will automatically be written and the fee deducted.

As chairman of the Financial Committee, I propose the following motion in regards to refunds. I propose we have a \$5.00 administrative fee on all refunds. This will cover the cost of processing the refund in regards to time, postage and check writing expenses. If the overpayment is \$5.00 the refund would be zero and all other refunds would have the \$5.00 fee deducted. The Society should not have any expense in processing refund.

VIII. Committee Reports and Discussion

Web Site/Internet: David Estis, Chair, reporting. Bluegrass Internet Services Sold: Bluegrass Internet Services is under new management. Casey Haley, now president, purchased the company from Ginny Grulkey 05/01/07. He will provide server and operating system software services for AHHS which include hardware maintenance and website hit statistical analysis. Ginny will continue to provide application software, website software and new project support. I have spoken to Casey and he will honor our contract for hosting and Ginny will continue with software support as before. *Bottomline*

- server down call Casey... Software not working call Ginny.

Registry Software Search: The Executive Secretary has taken this initiative and investigated a couple of packages. I have not done anything on this because of our fiscal situation. I recommend we place this initiative on hold until funding can be secured.

USEF Computer Meeting - The Executive Secretary was given permission, by the president, to attend this two-day affair. I received the summary report and *bottomline* the USEF wants to standardize the horse park on telecommunications protocol, hardware, software operating systems, and consolidate application software. This was a who are you - what do you have - what do you know informational meeting.

Annual Awards: Matthew Schuckert, Chair. No report received. Matt informed us that Lee and Beverly Dunn will be receiving the Hall Of Fame Award on Thursday night at Louisville. Please forward ideas on to him for breeder, trainer, etc, awards.

Audit Committee: Vern Houston, Chair, No report received.

David Estis raised the concern on addressing our deficit. The office is working on reducing expense.

By-Laws: Steven M. Golden, Chair, reporting. No report received.

Convention: Judith E. Lowry, Co-Chair reporting. On April 13, 2007, I attended a convention meeting at the UPHA office. Also in attendance for the AHHS was Linda Allen, member of the convention committee, Kristen Gallagher and Charlotte Carter representing the AHHSF. Ideas were discussed for live demonstrations at the Virginia Horse Center as well as subjects for a "round robin" type seminar similar to last year in Cincinnati. The schedule was also reviewed and tweaked to satisfy the need of all the meetings and attendees to our best abilities.

After viewing the bill from last year's convention, I had some questions about the division of income and expenses resulting in a committee being formed to examine a mutually acceptable and equitable arrangement between the two organizations for

future conventions. Members of the committee are Brent Jacobs, Judy Lowry and Linda Allen for the AHHS and John Jones and Karen Richardson for the UPHA. Hopefully we will have met prior to this meeting and will have information to share with you today.

Driving Competition/Dressage/Open Competition: Sandra Surber, Chair, reporting. We now have a new Open Competition Program (OCP) brochure available. We would like to continue to encourage people to show their Hackneys in open competition and to join this worthwhile program. At the present time, we have seen no real growth in the participation.

On the Carriage Driving scene, Elsa Mikkelsen once again competed successfully at the Del Mar Charity Fair Horse Show with her Hackney Horse, garnering good ribbons in the Open Carriage Classes. Denise Ruffing continues to compete with her Hackney Horse, Lucy, with a 20-year-old driving student sharing the driving. They will also take part in the National Drive at the Horse Park again this year. Celine Rickard has been actively and successfully competing in Combined Driving events on the West Coast with her Hackney Horse.

Hackney Horse Committee: Edward C. Murray, Chair. No report received.

Fund-Raising Auction: Brent A. Jacobs, Chair. Not much new on fund-raising. I'm looking for people to lead the live and silent auction. Also, need auction items.

I know who the owner/s were. The gentleman had died some time ago, but the lady is still alive (as of last December anyways). I need to know what would need to be done to match the papers back up with the animals...especially if we find that she has since died! (though I doubt it). Could you help me out here with information and steps to take. I have not yet tried to reach the lady who still holds the papers as I want to take the right steps.

The other thing I was wondering about is what would be the possibility of opening up a "half-Hackney" registry? There has been a lot of talk about this on the yahoo Hackney group list...and so far EVERYONE is in favor! I am not saying to open the books to the purebreds (as I am a staunch believer of keeping them pure), but to open a half-Hackney option. The reasons I will give

is beneficial to the Hackney. First of all, I was doing a search on dreamhorse.com yesterday for Hackneys/part Hackneys. There are only a dozen or so purebreds that are on the list so far, but the total that came up

for pure and part was 126. Most of the ones that are registered are either registered Pinto, American Warmblood, or half-Arab. These are only numbers of horses given that are on dreamhorse

for sale at this time. So the other part is the additional money that AHHS could bring in memberships and registration fees.

The best part though would be that the

Hackney could then be acknowledged more so in the ring and abroad. This is currently money lost and promotional possibilities lost as well...unless we

add a "half-Hackney" registry. The other bonus we could gain from this possibly, is if it were run like the 1/2 arab registry, the horse to be registered

would HAVE to have one registered Hackney parent in order to be registered. This then makes them seek for a Hackney mare or stallion to breed

to. Which again will help out the Hackney community. This would only serve to be a fruitful gain for the AHHS and the Hackney (I feel...and so do many others). Could you please

at least bring this up to the board. By the way, many of the horses listed are in the dressage and/or jumping ring. One is listed on dreamhorse for \$45,000. Could you imagine if there

was a 1/2 Hackney registry and they could then promote the papers at the shows? Just a thought. If by chance, the board decided to okay this, I would

be willing to help out in any way...including being a contact person, rep, or whatever... Thank you Judy for your time and consideration on this. Margo Hill
